



GENERAL INTEREST CLASSES **(FOR ADULT LEADERS & INTERESTED PARENTS)**

GEN1 Flag Etiquette (P1)

This course will review proper flag etiquette to be used at various ceremonies and meetings. Proper flag handling, display, saluting and more will be covered.

GEN2 BSA-LDS Relations (P2)

An overview of how the LDS church utilizes the BSA Cub and Boy Scout programs for the benefit of the Church, its members, and its mission. It will review how to incorporate the program to its full potential.

GEN3 Meet the Leaders (Lunch)

For all interested members and non-members of the BSA. Jeff Herrmann, Orange County Council's President and Scout Executive, John Hovanesian, Council Chairman, and Greg Beck, Council Commissioner will discuss the future of the Council and the Boy Scouts of America and answer any and all questions.

GEN4 Philmont High Adventure Base (P4)

High in the northeastern New Mexico mountains, there is a beautiful and wondrous place called Philmont. Learn what to expect at this National BSA High Adventure Camp and how to conduct a successful Philmont trek, planning, securing a date for your trek, and having a good time.

GEN5 Put the "Outing" in Sc-outing. (P1) or (P2)

This class will go over various activities that can be done on outing trips such as hiking, camping and backpacking. Leave-No-Trace, low impact, and fun activities will all be covered!

GEN6 Religious Awards (P3)

Learn about Religious Emblems and how they support a Scout's "Duty to God." All religious denominations have programs available for Cubs through Adults. An overview will be presented plus where specific information can be obtained and how your Scout can earn the emblem of his faith.

GEN7 International Scouting (P3)

Learn about the opportunities available to your Scout including World Jamborees, non-BSA National & Provincial Jamborees, Exchange & Hosting Programs, Jamboree-on-the-Air, Jamboree-on-the-Internet, Jamboree-on-the-Trail, World Friendship Fund, International Conference at Philmont, and International Service Awards.

GEN8 Understand ADD/ADHD & Special Needs Scouting (Two Period Class P4 & P5)

Do you work with ADD/ADHD, physically disabled, or mentally challenged youth? Learn new stimulating methods, program ideas, and trails of advancement to inspire your youth.

GEN9 On-Line Re-chartering & Advancement (P1) or (P2)

Frustrated by on-line re-chartering and advancement? Then this class is for you! You will learn the various steps of the re-chartering process and your unit's advancement report. With this course, you will become an expert!

GEN10 Risk Management (Safety & Health) (P1) or (P2)



This class will show you and your unit how to avoid risk and keep your youth and staff safe while Scouting! Everything from hazardous weather, water hazards, and hazards on the trail to general safety outside will be discussed and enable you to manage risk!

GEN11 Unit Fundraising (P3)

The Unit Fund Raising Chair sponsors fund raising and insures that every adult and youth member has the opportunity to participate in council, district, and unit events. Learn about the council's Popcorn sales and Scout-O-Rama ticket sales and BSA's policy for conducting individual unit events.

GEN12 Outdoor Ethics formerly Leave No Trace (P5)

This course introduces the Leave No Trace ethics and skills needed by Youth and Adults at all program levels to understand the basic principles and how to apply them in the outdoors. It also reviews the Boy Scout/Varsity Scout 2nd Class and 1st Class requirements and the Venturing Outdoor Bronze and Ranger Award requirements.

GEN13 Social Media Resources for Scouting (P4) or (P5)

Do you text, tweet, post, pin, blog, vlog, or cast? BSA does. Don't know what any of these things are? Come learn about the various sites and technologies already being utilized by the BSA and the Orange County Council, and where to find them. Recommendations and requirements on how to build your own sites will also be discussed.



GEN14 AED/CPR Basic First Aid (All Day Class)

This all-day class will cover the requirements of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED) certification training. Those who successfully complete this course will receive their Red Cross First Aid Card. The class is limited to the first 20 registrants. An additional fee for this class will be charged.

GEN15 Utilizing OCBSA Properties (P1)

The Orange County Council has an incredible variety of camping programs and facilities for Scouts and Scouters of all ages! Each facility, Oso Lake, Newport Sea Base, Schoepe Scout Reservation at Lost Valley or the Irvine Ranch Outdoor Education Center, is unique and offers the best outdoor experiences that Scouting offers! STEM programs, open camping, unique program weekends, shooting sports are just the start of what you and your Scouts can do. Each of the facility directors will present what's new and how you can incorporate these camps into your year-round Scouting program.

GEN16 Friends of Scouting (FOS) (P3)

Friends of Scouting is the vital lifeblood financial resource to sustain the scouting program. Come and learn how the process works and how you can become a part to make it successful for your unit and district. This course is designed for district Friends of Scouting team members.

GEN17 Charter Organization Representative (Two Period Class P1 & P2)

This class covers the responsibility of the Charter Organization Representative and their role as liaison between the organization leaders that sponsor a Cub Pack, Scout Troop or Venturing Crew and the Scout leaders of each unit.

GEN18 Religious Emblems Coordinator Class (P3)

Religious Emblems Coordinators (REC) or unit leaders who are interested in learning about the REC responsibilities. Discover a wide range of resources for supporting unit or district Duty to God and Religious Emblems programs. A 90 minute, interactive power point presentation featuring the tools and recourses from PRAY and other faith-based support information.

GEN 19 Parent Involvement Workshop (Two Period Class P1 & P2)

Our professional Scout staff walks you through what you can do to get involved at all levels of the Scouting program

GEN 20 Map and Compass (Two Period Class P2 & P3)

This course will help you find your way! Our Professional navigation instructors teach you to navigate with a map, compass, and GPS. Learn how to orient a map, use a compass, and follow waypoints confidently.

GEN 22 Merit Badge Day Coordinator (P3)

The MB Day Coordinator Training course is designed to teach Boy Scout Troops how to host their own Merit Badge Day. Any unit wishing to apply to host a MB Day must have two registered leaders complete this course prior to being approved to host an MB Day.

CUB2 Imaginative Pack Meetings (P4) or (P5)

Suggested Class for Cubmasters and Interested Parents

The pack meeting is the time to "join" the pack as one big family. Learn how to organize and lead this party, including entertainment, adult play-acting, decorations, jokes, ceremonies, stunts, skits, songs, run-ons, cheers & sparklers, focusing on exciting Pack meetings that involve all ages.

CUB3 Webelos Camping Introduction (P4)

Suggested Class for Cubmasters and Pack/ Parent Committee Members

CUB4 Lion Cubs (P1)

CUB5 Tiger Cubs (P2)

Suggested Class for Tiger Den leaders and Interested Parents

This is an exciting introduction to the Tiger Cub program for first grade boys. Learn how you as an adult partner can guide this program to open up the young inquisitive minds about indoor and outdoor activities, and the available resources.

CUB6 Exciting Cub Scout Awards (P3)

Suggested Class for Cubmasters and Pack/Parent Committee Members

Want to give your Cub program zip? Reward your Cubs with colorful patches, belt loops, and pins. Learn how Orange County Council's High Adventure Team's (HAT) Cub Adventure comprehensive recognition program can guide, enhance, motivate, and recognize participants in your Pack's outdoor program from the sea to the desert.

CUB7 (BOY13) Arrow-of-Light Transition (P2) or (P3)

Learn how the Pack Committee supports the yearly program planning, service projects, Pack meetings, Den meetings, training, Day Camp, Scout-O-Rama, camping, and Cub adventure activities. CUB10 A Scout Leader's Naturalist Guide (P4)

(FOR ADULT LEADERS & INTERESTED PARENTS OF BOYS AGE 11 THRU 17)

BOY1 Now You're a Scoutmaster or ASM – What Next? (P3)

Suggested Class for Scoutmasters, ASMs and Interested Parents

Learn about the priorities for Scoutmasters and ASMs in developing and guiding youth leadership at Troop meetings, Patrol Leader's Council, and working with the Troop Parent's Committee.

BOY2 The Patrol Method (P4) or (P5)

Suggested Class for Scoutmasters, ASMs & Interested Parents

Learn to encourage and train youth leaders to plan, delegate, conduct and evaluate the meetings and high adventures they develop and are responsible for with advice from the Scoutmaster. Learn the meaning of reflection and why failing successfully is not failure.

BOY3 Advancement – Scout to First Class (P4)

Suggested Class for Scoutmasters, ASMs, and Troop/Parent Committee Members

Learn tips & techniques to encourage "new" Scout advancement to First Class while participating in high adventure activities, youth leadership and experiencing the FUN of Scouting.

BOY4 Developing Youth Leaders (P2)

Suggested Class for Scoutmasters, ASMs, Venturing Advisers, Skippers & Interested Parents

BOY8 First Year Backpacking (P1) HAT Team

Suggested Class for Leaders of Boy Scouts & Venturers

The first few backpacks a new Scout takes must be a positive experience to develop a love of the wilderness. Learn how to establish a first year backpacking program that develops the skill and confidence to become an experienced trekker. Learn about locations, equipment and awards that can be earned.

BOY9 Tailgate Camping – Novice to Expert (P1)

Suggested Class for Leaders of Boy Scouts & Venturers

Learn about the activities and equipment needed for the camper graduating from backyard to wilderness. Checkout beaches, mountains, deserts, and forests, and learn the proper safety procedures, equipment, and permits needed. Discover new and exciting activities for your campout and where to go.

BOY10 Responsibilities of a Troop Committee (P3)

DEN CHIEF TRAINING

(FOR BOY SCOUTS AND YOUTH CREW MEMBERS)

DC1 Den Chief Training (All Day Class)

An all day series of exciting activities that prepare Den Chiefs to become leaders and mentors of Tiger Cubs, Wolf & Bear Cub Scouts, or Webelos Scouts. Actively serving as Den Chief for a prescribed length of time can satisfy leadership requirements in a Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team, or Venturing Crew. Bring your Den Chief Handbook, pencil, and paper.



COMMISSIONERS COLLEGE

(FOR UNIT COMMISSIONERS, ASSISTANT DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS AND DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS)

COM1 Commissioners Basic Training (P1 through P3)

This training will examine what a Commissioner is, what a Commissioner does, and how a Commissioner does it.

COM2 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P1)

BCS101 The Commissioner Concept

This course will introduce the history of commissioner service, describe the concept of commissioner service, list the key duties of commissioners, identify ways to demonstrate good commissioner service, and learn to be a representative of the Boy Scouts of America.

COM3 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P1)

BCS110 The Commissioner Style

A commissioner's *style*—*how they* provide service—is as important as what they do in the service process. To help units succeed, today's commissioners must be people-oriented more than procedures-oriented. They are truly a council's frontline diplomats. Because they operate mostly by persuasion rather than by edict, Unit Commissioners should exercise the highest degree of diplomacy.

COM4 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P1)

MCS-303 Commissioner Lifesaving

This session sets the stage for saving a unit and reviews the basic unit lifesaving steps. Getting to know your units will help you identify when, and how to address issues they face in keeping the units strong and successful.

COM5 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P2)

BCS-103 The Commissioner and the District

Scouting is a uniquely volunteer movement whose success is due to the special relationship of those volunteers and the professional staff who assist the Council, District and Unit operations. This course explains how these relationships work.

COM6 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P2)

BCS117 Selecting Quality Leaders

Learn an effective process for finding the right person to fill a unit's leadership needs.

COM7 Master of Commissioner Science (P2)

MCS-313 Orienting and training Commissioners

This course covers all aspects of commissioner training, including new commissioner orientation, basic training, Arrowhead Honor, the Commissioner Award of Excellence in Unit Service, the Commissioner's Key, the Distinguished Commissioner Service Award, and continuing education. A variety of classroom techniques are also reviewed.

COM8 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P3)

BCS-107 Unit Journey to Excellence

Learn about the elements of the Unit Journey to Excellence and what it takes to ensure success in every unit.

COM9 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P3)

BCS-130 Commissioners and Advancement

A Commissioner should be prepared to assist a unit with basic questions about Advancement. This course describes why and what a Commissioner should know about advancement.

COM10 Master of Commissioner Science (P3)

MCS-318 Top 10 Ways to Ensure Good Comm Service

Today everyone has their top 10 list, including commissioners. This session is designed to help experienced commissioners review their priorities.

COM11 Doctor of Commissioner Science (P4)

DCS-501 Selecting a Thesis Topic

This discussion workshop will introduce those candidates who are beginning the DCS program to the process of proposing and preparing a DCS thesis.

COM12 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P4)

BCS-102 Supporting Timely Charter Renewal

Commissioners are responsible for on-time unit charter renewal so it is essential that they understand the charter concept in the Boy Scouts of America and are fully familiar with the steps in the charter renewal process.

COM13 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P4)

BCS-121 Intro to Venturing Commissioner Service

This course is an introduction to Venturing program for commissioners who are not familiar with the Venturing. It is design to help commissioner have a better understand of the Venturing program.

COM14 Master of Commissioner Science (P4)

MCS-322 Adv Scouting with Disabilities

This course will provide Commissioners with knowledge to share with unit leaders so they can provide a program which provides special needs youth with the Scouting opportunities to succeed.

COM15 Doctor of Commissioner Science (P5)

DCS-503 Developing a Thesis Topic

This will be a workshop in which we work together to develop thesis plans for our participants

COM16 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P5)

BCS-116 Collaborative Assessments

As we work through this session, we'll examine the need for collaboration in assessing unit strengths and needs. We'll see how this leads to the development of a unit service plan and how it's implementation leads to continuous unit improvement. Then we'll examine the responsibilities of the unit key 3 and unit commissioner in ensuring unit needs are met.

COM17 Bachelor of Commissioner Science (P5)

BCS-124 Venturing crew Visitation

The highest priority of the commissioner is a visitation to see the health of unit. This is an overview of how commissioners will be preparing themselves in a crew visitation.

Com18 Master of Commissioner Science (P5)

MCS-317 Recruiting New Commissioners

Quality programs flourish and membership grows in a Scouting district only when there is a complete team of quality commissioners. This avoids overloading the same few volunteers who rarely say no, but who may find it easier to drop out of Scouting than to complain, "That's enough! I can't do anymore!"
